ORDER OF DETENTION  
PENDING TRIAL

07-CR-106-C

At the July 12, 2007 arraignment the government moved pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) to detain defendant Adolfo Ortiz pending further proceedings in this illegal re-entry prosecution. Because defendant already is in custody because of an unmet state bond and a BICE detainer, he is not contesting detention at this time but has reserved his right to a substantive de novo hearing upon request. Based on this and the currently uncontested information contained in the pretrial service report, I find that defendant presents a substantial risk of nonappearance.

Therefore, it is ORDERED that the defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate jail separate from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of this court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the jail shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
