PRETRIAL MOTION  
HEARING ORDER

07-CR-107-C

On August 29, 2007 this court held the telephonic pretrial motion hearing. Defendant Todd Moe did not participate personally, but was represented by his attorney, William Ginsberg. The government was represented by Assistant United States Attorney John Vaudreuil.

Prior to the hearing, Moe filed a motion to disclose exculpatory evidence and a demand for disclosure (dkts. 8 and 9). After taking a discovery proffer from the government and discussing the issues with both sides, I denied the motion as unnecessary and took no direct action on the demand other than to set a September 17, 2007 deadline for government expert witness disclosure, with a reciprocal defense expert disclosure deadline of October 1, 2007. Although the parties are working through some intriguing legal issues, they had no other matters to bring to the court's attention at this time, and it is not clear whether this case will go to trial. I will provide draft voir dire questions and jury instructions

to the parties closer to their mid-September submission deadline for the final pretrial conference.
