At the January 9, 2008 arraignment the government moved pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §3142(f) to detain defendant Christopher W. Dallum pending his trial in this child pornography prosecution. Because defendant is in state custody, he is not contesting detention at this time but he has reserved his right to a substantive hearing upon request. Therefore, based on the currently uncontested information in the pretrial services report, I find that defendant is a danger to the community.

Therefore, it is ORDERED that the defendant is committed to the custody of the United States Marshals Service for confinement at a proximate secure facility separate from persons awaiting or serving sentences or being held in custody pending appeal. The defendant shall be afforded a reasonable opportunity for private consultation with his attorney. On order of this court or on request of an attorney for the Government, the secure facility shall deliver the defendant to the Marshals Service for the purpose of an appearance in this case.
