Defendant William Earl Jones has asked for an order requiring the United States Marshal Service to provide specified dental care to defendant while he remains in its custody. According to defendant, the Bureau of Prisons will provide him a root canal and tooth restoration of his badly rotted molar, but the marshals services balks at doing anything more for defendant than arranging for an extraction.

As soon as defendant is sentenced, he will return to the custody of the Bureau of Prisons to finish a sentence imposed on him sometime ago and to begin serving any sentence imposed on him in this case. At this time, defendant's sentencing is set for March 6.

Although I will not order the marshals service to arrange for a root canal for defendant, I am willing to move the sentencing up to February 19, 2009, at 2:00 pm or any

time in the morning of February 20, 2009, if counsel and the probation office can accommodate the change and if it would help make it possible for defendant to be returned to the Bureau of Prisons in time to have the dental work he wishes.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that defendant William Earl Jones's motion for an order requiring the United States Marshals Service to arrange for him to have root canal surgery is DENIED.
