ORDER

Plaintiff Bradley Jones is proceeding in this case on his claim that defendant Darrel Kuhl failed to protect him from another prisoner when he was detained at the Columbia County Jail. Defendant filed a motion for summary judgment on October 28, 2010. Plaintiff was supposed to file his opposition to this motion by November 29, 2010. Instead, plaintiff filed a motion for a 45 day deadline extension.

In his motion, plaintiff states that he is unable to respond to defendant's summary judgment motion until obtains a specific missing document originally generated by the Federal Correctional Institution in Oxford. Plaintiff states that he has made continuous efforts to obtain this evidence and is currently awaiting a response from Oxford. Therefore, he requests additional time to file his brief. As I stated in my August 18, 2010 order denying plaintiff's previous motion for a general extension of time (dkt. 45), plaintiff could seek to extend his deadlines if, despite trying hard, he was unable to obtain documents in time to file or respond to a dispositive motion. *See* dkt. 46.

I won't give the plaintiff 45 days, but I will give him three weeks, until December 20, 2010 to file his brief in opposition. Because of the holidays, defendants may have until January 4, 2011 to file their reply. Plaintiff shall not receive any more extensions of his deadline.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff's motion for an extension of time to file his brief in opposition to defendant's motion for summary judgment, dkt. #62, is GRANTED. Plaintiff shall file his opposition brief by December 20, 2010 and defendants may file their reply brief not later than December 30, 2010.
