On May 12, 2010, I dismissed the petition for writ of habeas corpus of petitioner Tayr K. al Ghashiyah (Khan) without prejudice because his claims were not properly brought in a habeas corpus petition and he had not shown he was entitled to relief on his claim that he was denied good time credits. On May 24, 2010, I denied his motion for reconsideration because he did not provide any dates or facts relating to any disciplinary proceedings in which he was deprived of good time credits.

Now, he moves to reopen this case. Dkt. #15. Attached to his motion is a list of the conduct reports he has received and the good time credits he has lost. Unfortunately, this information is insufficient for me to determine whether his due process rights were violated

in any specific disciplinary proceeding or whether he has exhausted his administrative and state court remedies with respect to any conduct report. Without additional information, I can not determine whether his custody is unconstitutional. Therefore, I must deny his motion to reopen his petition for a writ of habeas corpus.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the motion to reopen of petitioner Tayr K. al Ghashiyah (Khan), dkt. #15, is DENIED.
