ORDER

In this petition for a writ of habeas corpus brought under 28 U.S.C. § 2241, petitioner William Harry Thompson contends that two of the three convictions that formed the basis of his career offender sentence are no longer considered crimes of violence under 18 U.S.C. § 924(e). On October 26, 2010, I ordered respondent Holinka to file a response to this petition not later than 20 days from the date of service of the petition showing cause, if any, why this writ should not issue on petitioner's claim.

Now before the court is respondent Holinka's motion for enlargement of time to file a response to petitioner's 2241 petition. Respondent's current deadline to respond is November 16, 2010 and she requests a 14-day extension to November 30, 2010. In support of the motion, Assistant United States Attorney Alice Green has submitted an affidavit. Green asserts that the criminal records for Thompson are located in the United States Attorney's office in the District of Minnesota and that in order to properly respond to the issues raised by petitioner's petition, she will need to consult with the Assistant United States Attorney in Minnesota, Andrew Dunne, who was assigned to Thompson's criminal case.

To allow respondent an opportunity to review the records in William Thompson's criminal case, I will grant respondent an extension of time until November 30, 2010 to respond to the order to show cause why petitioner's petition of habeas corpus should not be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that respondent Carol Holinka's motion for an extension of time until November 30, 2010 to file her response to this court's October 26, 2010 order is GRANTED. Petitioner William Thompson may have 20 days from the time that respondent serves the response to file a traverse to the allegations of this response.
