MEMORANDUM

10-cr-118-bbc

Defendant has written to the court asking that he be allowed to remain at the Dane County jail until he is designated to an institution by the Bureau of Prisons so that he can be as close as possible to his family in Madison. Until such time as the Bureau of Prisons designates defendant to a prison, he is in the custody of the U.S. Marshals Service. While I have no objection to the defendant remaining at the Dane County jail pending designation to another facility, it is up to the U.S. Marshals Service to decide where prisoners are housed. It considers many factors in making such a determination, such as jail space restrictions, medical concerns and the need to separate certain offenders from one another.

I will send a copy of this memorandum to the U.S. Marshals Service so that it is aware of defendant's request. I am confident that if it is possible for defendant to remain at the Dane County jail pending designation, that the U.S. Marshals Service will make every effort to fulfill that request.
