ORDER

Plaintiff Heather Nelson is suing defendant Santander Consumer USA, Inc. for violations of various federal and state consumer laws for actions it took to collect a debt on a vehicle loan. Trial is scheduled for June 10, 2013.

In an order dated March 8, 2013, magistrate judge Stephen Crocker granted in part and denied in part plaintiff's motion to compel discovery of information related to defendant Santander's net worth, which plaintiff argued she needed to know so that she could determine an appropriate amount of punitive damages. Dkt. #143. The magistrate judge ordered defendant to "file, ex parte and under seal, a sworn statement of its approximate value as a company. Judge Crabb then shall determine in what manner this information may be used by the parties in any determination of punitive damages." Id.

In response to this order, plaintiff has filed another motion to order defendant to

disclose its net worth to her. Dkt. #145. However, plaintiff does not even acknowledge that she is seeking review of the magistrate judge's decision or address the standard of review under 28 U.S.C. § 636 and Fed. R. Civ. P. 72, much less develop an argument that the law entitles her to more than what the magistrate judge ordered. Accordingly, I am denying her motion.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that plaintiff Heather Nelson's "motion to disclose [defendant] Santander Consumer USA, Inc.'s stated net worth to plaintiff," dkt. #145, is DENIED.
