ORDER

Defendant has been convicted of a drug crime to which the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 3143 are applicable, that is one for which he is to be detained pending sentencing, absent extraordinary circumstances. Defendant has complied with all conditions while on pretrial release and is not likely to flee. He has a young child who has had a liver transplant and is vulnerable to infections. He shares custody of this child with his ex-wife and needs time to make arrangements for his daughter's care before he goes into prison. I consider this an extraordinary enough circumstance that I am allowing defendant to remain free on conditions for six weeks, or until January 23, 2012, when he is to report to the United States Marshals Service in this building between the hours of 10 a.m and noon. All of the previously imposed conditions remain in effect until defendant has turned himself in to the

marshals service.
