Defendant Jose Luis Castillo Madrigal has filed objections to the report and recommendation filed by United States Magistrate Judge Stephen L. Crocker. Magistrate Judge Crocker recommended denial of defendant's motion to dismiss the conspiracy charges against him and to require the government to give him a bill of particulars. Defendant concedes that under the current law of the circuit, this court cannot grant either of his motions. Given this concession and the thoroughness of the magistrate judge's explanation why defendant is not entitled to a more detailed indictment or to a bill of particulars in this case, I will adopt the magistrate judge's recommendation without further comment.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that the report and recommendation filed by United States Magistrate Judge Stephen L. Crocker on January 30, 2013, dkt. #92, is ADOPTED by the

court as its own. FURTHER, IT IS ORDERED that defendant Jose Luis Castillo Madrigal's motion to dismiss the conspiracy charges contained in counts 1 and 3 of the superseding indictment, dkt. #84, and to order the government to provide him a bill of particulars is DENIED.
