APPLICATION FOR INDIGENT DEFENDER PANEL WESTERN DISTRICT OF WISCONSIN

Thank you for considering this application for membership on the Indigent Defender Panel, for the Western District of Wisconsin. With the opening of Federal Defender Services of Wisconsin, Inc. in this district as of January, 2005, total private appointments under the Criminal Justice Act of 1964 (CJA) will be fewer, probably constituting 25 - 40% of the indigent persons accused in federal court here.

That change in the number of appointments presents an unprecedented opportunity to strengthen the CJA panel, and to build a solid core of indigent defenders who practice regularly in federal court. For those selected to serve on the revamped and possibly smaller Indigent Defender panel, they may see more federal appointments, not fewer. Initially, we hope to form an Indigent Defender panel of approximately 35 lawyers, or some number close to that. Lawyers serving on the panel should expect **at least 3 - 5 appointments in federal court a year.** All lawyers in good standing in the Wisconsin bar will be eligible to apply for the Indigent Defender panel. Absence of initial inclusion will not mean permanent exclusion.

But membership on the panel will entail a significant commitment to superior defense in federal criminal cases. Regular CLE programs focused on federal criminal practice will be an obligation. Another obligation for some may be peer review of pending applications and service as a "first-chair" lawyer with applicants who seek admission to the Indigent Defender panel. Most importantly, the ability to accept 3 - 5 appointments every year and to represent indigent clients well and vigorously will be essential for Indigent Defender panel members.

If you can make this commitment, the Federal Defender's office invites you to apply. We look forward to working with you in federal court. You may apply at any time, and applications will be considered on a rolling basis.
